

North Carolina Space Grant Consortium Community College Scholarships for 2005-2006

Scholarship Description

Scholarships for \$2000, will be awarded competitively to community college students in NC who will be transferring to one of the eight Space Grant Universities listed below in science, engineering or technology in the fall of 2005. This is part of the Workforce Development Program in NASA to help educate students to pursue careers in science, engineering or technology of interest to NASA. The community college applicants must have been admitted to one of the eight Space Grant Universities for full-time studies in the fall of 2005 and be pursuing a BS or higher degree program in science, engineering or technology of interest to NASA. The award is for one year only.

Eligibility Requirements

Applicants must be classified as full-time undergraduate students pursuing degrees in engineering or science disciplines of interest to NASA at one of the eight member universities, during the award period. Applicants must have a grade point average of 3.0/4.0 or greater at their community college. Applicants must be United States Citizens or permanent residents. Applicants are only eligible to receive the award once.

Application

The application must include the following:

- (1) Application cover sheet provided by the Consortium with required signature.
- (2) Student resume including goals and research experience (2 pages).
- (3) Student's **official** community college transcript.

Deadline

Applications must be submitted no later than **April 15, 2005**. Announcement of awards will be made by May 5, 2005.
